

THE YEAR IN REVIEW

As I looked back on the year, I am never surprised by the generosity of our Club! No matter the event, the charity, the program, you are always there willing and able to help. Our Club truely embraces the theme of "Giving Back".

Our projects are year round (we are supposed to take a break during the summer). Here is what we did:

BEAUTIFICATION: In September, we joined with other community members to plant mums at Village Green, in the fountain, 16 street





ST. KILIAN OUTREACH: In August, we collected school supplies to be taken to St. Kilian Outreach. We delivered backpacks, composition notebooks, loose leafs and paper, pens, pencils, crayons, rulers, magic markers, post-its, and colored pencils. St. Kilian Outreach serves approximately 150 families. Our supplies were combined with those of other organizations to help these families.

On a monthly basis, we donate paper goods to Outreach. We were specifically asked to do this as it something that is often forgot about.

We started collecting food and monetary donations in October. Turkeys were purchased and the food was delivered on November 7th. Again, helping many needy families in Farmingdale.

EPIC HOUSE: We provide a holiday basket filled with treats for the residents of this home on Main Street in Farmingdale.

MADONNA HEIGHTS: Santa Bag Project: Any Club member who wished to participate in the project took a red holiday gift bag and filled it with toys, dolls, books and/or childrens items to be delivered to Madonna Heights for distribution at Christmas time. We delivered over 60 bags.

For Mother's Day we filled new or gently used pocketbooks with articles for the moms including small make up bags from Estee Lauder. We also included stuffed animals and other items for children. We delivered these items prior to Mother's Day.

GFWC INTERNATIONAL AMBASSADOR PROGRAM: We had several luncheons over the course of the year to help a not for profit called Fitness for Africa. Fitness for Africa helps children in Gulu, Uganda. We have raised over \$1500. At each luncheon, a portion of the cost is donated to this program. This is a wonderful way for our Club to socialize and help at the same time.

We have also given money to Sisters of St. Claire Clarisse in Italy. A donation was sent to them during the holiday season for \$500.

CRAFTS COMMITTEE: Members created items to be sold at the Columbus Day Weekend Fair. We had members donate material and items made. We also participated in a bake sale. Monies raised went to Ways and Means. We have also continued to make lap robes and blankets to be donated to veterans.


