#### DOLORES CIANCIABELLA NAMED 2016 "WOMAN OF DISTINCTION"

It is with great pleasure we announce our own, "Dolores Cianciabella", as the recipient of the above award, "Woman of

Distinction". A beautiful ceremony with Dolores receiving an outstanding proclamation from Assemblyman Tom McKevitt along with nine other women. What an honor it was for us to see Dolores standing there to receive her award. Dolores, we are so proud of you.

Dolores raised three children while earning a teaching degree at Hofstra University and began her career as a Kindergarten teacher at Woodward Parkway School in Farmingdale. In 1971 she completed an Early Childhood Masters' Degree at Adelphi University. She broadened her knowledge by traveling all over the world to learn about education in other countries, including China.

In 1980 she began volunteering at Our Lady of Lourdes Church bingo night and has continued this commitment for 35 years. From 1982-84 Dolores taught pre-K religion classes to youngsters while their parents attended Mass.

Dolores was a Kindergarten teacher for the Farmingdale School District for 26 years, teaching classes with 50 children/day (2 sessions) and eventually retired in 1992.

Her volunteerism broadened when she joined Farmingdale AARP and worked in a Grand-

parent Program for Head Start for 10 years with underprivileged children. In 1993 she started volunteering at Mid-Island Hospital which is now called St. Joseph's and continues to volunteer there every Tuesday where she works in Community Relations and visits patients to offer comfort.

Dolores joined the Women's Club of Farmingdale in 1980 as a Nite-Lite (evening division for working women) and served a two-year term as President. While in Nite-Lites, the General Federation of Women's Clubs (GFWC) requested clubs to conduct programs stressing reading to children. Dolores dived right in and created a reading program at the Farmingdale Public Library for 5-6 year olds during the summer. Together with members of the Farmingdale Women's Club, she read one-on-one to the children. More recently, she (and WCF members) have been reading to local nursery school children.

Dolores served as Corresponding Secretary of the Farmingdale Women's Club from 2004 to 2006. Her role took on more responsibility when she offered to help the new president with her duties as needed. As a result, she was then elected president herself for the 2006-08 club year. Her goal was to bring in new members and during her administration ten new members joined and became actively involved in all aspects of club activities. Several of them moved on to hold positions on the Executive Board.

While president in 2007, she attended the GFWC Convention in Pennsylvania. She took the convention theme, "Empowering Women One by One," to heart and introduced their programs to the club. Members took a more active interest in the GFWC because of the information she brought back. She has attended every convention since then.

During her administration the club donated \$2,050 to repair and re-build the fountain in the Village Green Park; she helped design a WCF100th Anniversary cookbook; she worked on the Village Beautification Committee; and served as Chairman for the club's annual Art in the Park Festival for one year. Monies raised made it possible for the Women's Club of Farmingdale to present a \$1,000 scholastic award to a Farmingdale art student.

When her term of office as President ended in 2008, Dolores accepted a position as GFWC-NYS Education Chairman and served two, 2-year terms. She then held the position of Public Issues Partnership Chairman for two terms. Dolores then went on to also serve two terms on the Board of the Long Island Federation of Women's Clubs, Inc.

For the past few years, Dolores has been the liaison between the Junior League of Women's Club of Farmingdale and The Woman's Club of Farmingdale. She keeps our club informed on all the Junior League activities and programs.

With all this volunteer work, Dolores still finds time to enjoy playing bridge; she is a member of the WCF book club and is also part of a Creative Writing Group that chronicles family memories into short stories. She has won awards for her short stories and one of her stories won 1st place at the General Federation of Women's Club of New York State and again at the GFWC National level.

#### **EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING - OCTOBER 20 - 10:00 AM**

On August 26, 1920, the 19th Amendment was officially certified, granting women the right to vote. This historic day marked the culmination of the women's suffrage movement, which began in 1848 in Seneca Falls, New York. In 1971, Con-


gress designated August 26 as Women's Equality Day, giving us the opportunity to celebrate the passage of the 19th amendment and remember the strong women who fought so hard for many of the rights we often take for granted today.


We honor these suffragists who marched, picketed, and spoke out for the right to vote. We are also proud that GFWC played an important role in the women's suffrage movement, with clubwomen such as Julia Ward Howe and Frances Elizabeth Willard serving as prominent leaders in the fight for women's equality.

It's hard to believe that women received the right to vote less than 100 years ago, and have made true strides as doctors, politicians, teachers, and more since this time. Although women have truly come a long way in



this country, there is still more that needs to be done. GFWC will continue to advocate for women's equality and ensure our voices are heard.
